- Australian exporters are in a prime position to benefit from emerging export opportunities in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA), as the region seeks to reduce its reliance on oil as its major source of revenue, and transform and modernise its economies and societies for a post-oil world.
- Population growth (355 million set to double by 2050), high energy prices, water scarcity (the overall UAE water consumption ranks 82% above the global average and is expected to grow by 30% by 2030, whilst the current use of groundwater reservoirs is 15 times more than the natural recharge rates), major events such as Expo 2020, corporate

- Given 90 per cent of the region's food requirements are met through imports, the region is investing in agricultural production and food processing, as well as water management education.
- Middle Eastern governments (particularly UAE, Oman and Saudi Arabia) are actively promoting the aquaculture sector for investment and development domestically.
- Government policymakers in MENA, particularly Saudi Arabia and the UAE, are increasingly turning to vocational education, which is seen as a cheaper and more hands-on educational experience, to reduce a dependence on foreign labour, address domestic skill shortages and tackle growing unemployment.
